Friday 8th November 2019—Arturo Ezquerro

'The Power of Group Attachment'

Arturo Ezquerro is a group analyst, consultant psychiatrist, and psychoanalytic psychotherapist. He is a senior trainer and assessor at the Institute of Group Analysis and former Head of NHS Psychotherapy Services in Brent, London. Arturo has over 70 publications in 5 languages, including the books *Relatos de Apego* (Psimatica) and *Encounters with John Bowlby: Tales of Attachment* (Routledge). Bowlby was his supervisor and his mentor at the Tavistock Clinic between 1984 and 1990.

Friday 13th December 2019 - Brinley Yare

'The Case Study'

Brinley Yare has a long-standing interest in teaching research design and practice. He completed his initial academic studies with a PhD in cultural history, which turned out to be unexpectedly good preparation for subsequent training and practice as a psychoanalytic psychotherapist. Having held a number of senior academic posts, he currently teaches research methodology as a staff member on the doctoral programme in Child and Adolescent Psycho-therapy at the Tavistock, and leads the 'Experience and Evidence' seminar series for IGA trainees in London. He works in private practice as a psychoanalytic psychotherapist, and clinical and research supervisor.

Friday 27th March 2020 - Martin Bhurruth

'Group Analysis, Neuroscience and the Matrix'

Martin Bhurruth is a Group Analyst, currently working in the NHS as Clinical Lead for Francis Dixon Lodge Therapeutic Community in Leicester. He also serves as Convenor for the Midlands Foundation Course in Group Analysis. Martin is interested in group analysis as a method of inquiry and queries the extent and limitations of how it can help the day to day concerns that people have. He has published papers on The Matrix, The Tour de France, Neuroscience and the Matrix and Leadership in Therapeutic Communities.

Friday 5th June 2020 - Graham Mackay

'A Group Analytic frame for understanding and working with Personality Disorder'

Graham Mackay originally trained as a psychiatric nurse and recently retired from working in the NHS for the last 25 years, where he has had a particular interest in therapeutic community work and in developing psycho-dynamically informed services for people diagnosed with personality disorders. He is a group analyst and a qualified supervisor and is convenor for the Midlands Foundation Course in Group Analysis. He also teaches on the Institute of Group Analysis Diploma in Supervision course and is currently a senior therapist in the specialist psychotherapies service in Birmingham.
